Weekly Reminders

Spellings for this week are the months of the year -

May	November
June	December

In your homework book please write out each spelling in your best handwriting, putting each month into a sentence.

E.g. In September the leaves start to change colour. In September it is my birthday. In September it starts to get much colder.

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Geography

This term we are looking at mapping skills and one idea that the children will be investigating is how to show different landscape features on maps.

Therefore I would like them to colour the enclosed map, in the colours indicated in the key, to show clearly how the mountainous areas are spread across the UK. If they would like to extend their knowledge they could find out where the highest mountains are in each country (Snowdon in Wales, Scafell Pike in England, Ben Nevis in Scotland & Carruntoohil in Ireland) and label them.
