You are going to research a saint - you can either choose a saint of your choice or you can get some suggestions from school or the reading comprehension. You need to find out key information about the saint you choose: their feast day; why they were recognised as a saint (what was special about them); where and when your saint lived; any other important information.

2. **Complete the Reading Comprehension task: All Saints' Day.** You need to read the text carefully. Answer the questions in the most appropriate manner - use a complete sentence when it is necessary.

Maths

Complete the Maths Mystery task. You are familiar with this style of activity. There are two different tasks to choose from so you can challenge yourself appropriately. The activities are based on fireworks and bonfires which links to the events happening this weekend. You might also know that fireworks were also used to celebrate the Hindu Festival of Light, Diwali, last week.

Spellings

1. Continue to familiarise yourself with the spellings on the Year 3 and 4 and Year 5 and 6 spelling words sheets. You will have a 'test' on these words.
2. This week you are going to look at the spelling words on the right hand side of the sheet (the third column on the sheet). You need to practise these words and you will be tested on them next week and you need to show that you are using them in your work. **(Regular daily practice is important.)**
