### Class notices:

On Friday, we saw a wonderful Advent Service as part of our assembly. We will be learning and sharing some readings and songs as a class as part of our own Advent Service which will be a bit different from usual. This week, you need to learn the words and actions to Midnight as well as your class song.

Remember that you need to have a coat in school every day, including Tuesday when it can still rain and be cold! You can also bring in your school PE fleece to wear as an extra layer in class.

Remember that it is PE Day on Tuesday so wear your PE kit to school and with a warm tracksuit on top. You should not be wearing earrings on your PE day.

### RE

1. Read the Wednesday Word with your parents. This is emailed to your parents each week.
2. Practise singing Midnight and learn the actions to the chorus so that we can share this as a class. You also need to practise your class song so that you know the words and actions. The words and YouTube link will be on Google classroom so that you can practise at home.

### Times tables

Knowing your times tables is really important and it will help you in so many areas of Maths.

Rehearse multiplication and division facts using the games on Education City or <https://www.timestables.co.uk/>. An adult or older sibling could quiz you for 2 minutes every day!

**Year 3** Make sure that you know the 2, 5 and 10 times tables. Keep practising the 3x, 4x, and 8x which you are part of your classwork.

**Year 4** Make sure that you know and practise the 2, 5, 10 and 3, 6, 4 and 7, 8, 9 times tables. Practise answering your times tables using the Times Tables Check on the website that you have been using in class <https://www.timestables.co.uk/>.

### Reading

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1. Make sure that you are reading your school reading book every night. You should be reading aloud to an adult. When you have finished your book you need to ensure that you change your book by asking an adult if you can change it.

  - Who wrote it?
  - Where in Britain was it written?
  - What type of text was is this? How do you know?
