Classroom Routines


- Start of day doors open 8:40

- Phonics Screening for Year 1 and end of year assessments for Year 2 (SATs).




Curriculum

As a whole school we are continuing to focus on the children having a Growth Mindset.


This refers to having a positive attitude to learning e.g. thinking 'I'll try a different strategy' instead of 'I'll never do it, it's too hard.

Reading

- 10 mins a day at home.
- Sign and date reading record.
- Books must be kept for at least 2 nights.
- Books or sections should be re-read.






Reading

There are two strands of learning to read:

 Word level reading (developing strategies to decode words).

 Comprehension (understanding the text).





Guided Reading

- · Group and individual reading each week.
- · Detailed records are kept at school.
- The reading records sent home are for our communications.
- · Guided reading= challenging texts.
- · Home reading books= 90% fluency.



Before Reading-Book Talk

- Discuss the title of the book?
- What do you think this book is about?
- Walk through the book, identify any difficult vocabulary. Pre teach it.

After reading- Discuss the story

- What happened?
- Why did it happen?
- · How did characters feel?





Examples

- · Who is you favourite character? Why?
- Ask how the character is feeling at different points in the story.
- Tell me about where the story takes place.
- · What do you think might happen next?




Maths

- We are continuing our Mastery approach to our Maths curriculum.
- We aim to develop children's fluency, reasoning and problem solving skills.
- We will teach concepts through concrete, pictorial and abstract methods.



Maths

- Arithmetic is very important (learning number bonds, doubles etc.).
- We have daily fluency sessions for the children to practise their number skills.



English


We follow Pie Corbett's Talk for Writing approach.

This involves:


- Lots of oral telling

Phonics

• Phonics every day- alternative graphemes: happy, treat, week, these, ...


The sounds and key words that children need to be able to spell by the end of the year are printed in the new Reading Records. These are called

'Common Exception Words' and 'High Frequency Words'.



Benefits of cursive script:

- Pencil/pen does not need to be lifted from the pagereinforces phonic and spelling patterns and words (muscle motor memory)
- Helps writing to be fluent and fast.
- A lead in stroke avoids confusion about where to begin letter formation.

Homework is currently given out on Tuesdays and due in the following Monday.




P.E Kit

- Earrings will have to be taken out or covered. Plain stud only.




Extras
