Word Classes

- Sentences are built and developed through the use of word groups.
- * There are eight major word classes in the English language.
- * Noun, verb, adjective, adverb, pronoun, preposition, conjunction, determiner.
- In Key Stage 1 the children begin to learn about nouns, verbs, adjectives and adverbs.
- In Year 3 the children learn about prepositions and conjunctions and in Year 4 the children learn about pronouns and determiners.

The basic word types

- Noun: object/thing/place/name
- * Verb: doing or being word
- Adverb: describes how the verb is being done (mostly, but not always, ends in -ly)
- * Adjective: describes a noun

The basic word types

- Pronoun: replaces a noun (I, me, he, she, him, her, they, we, us, it, etc)
- Conjunction: links together two clauses (parts of/information in) in a sentence e.g. but, because, although.
- Preposition: show the relationship between two words such as time, location or direction e.g. up, after, across, into, past, under
- * Determiner: words that introduce nouns e.g. *a*, the, every.
